Grant funding \$143,544.62 has been awarded to 17 local community service organizations.

The following **Community Impact Grants** are funded from our Campbellford/Seymour Community Fund:

- <u>Aron Theatre Cooperative Inc.</u> in partnership with Innresponse a \$5,000 grant to engage the community, develop new and sustainable programming, and grow the membership of the Aron Indigenous Circle.
- Artworth Trent Hills Arts & Nature Campin partnership with Innresponse a \$5,000 grant to develop a succession and sustainability plan for Artworth.
- <u>Bike Action Trent Hills</u> in partnership with the Rotary Club of Campbellford a \$4,860 grant to raise awareness of Bike Action and the importance of active transportation through the creation of 6 videos to be shown at the Aron Theotre
- <u>Campbellford and District Curling and Racquet Club</u> a \$4,792.90 grant to update a piece of their fitness equipment to ensure their fitness centre can remain competitive.
- <u>Campbellford District High School</u> in partnership with KPRDSB Charitable Trust a \$4,139.91 grant to revamp the Food & Nutrition program so that students can improve their food preparation skills and produce high-quality food for others in the school community.
- <u>Campbellford-Seymour Heritage Society</u> a \$5,000 grant to purchase a hub to run the three Trent Hills Sports Wall of Honour kiosks that will be placed in the three local recreation centers.
- <u>Friends of the Campbellford/Seymour Carnegie Library</u> a \$2,640 grant to install a public art project in the children's section of the library, as well as refreshing the Bell box outside the entrance of the library with a mural. Includes partial funding from our Arts & Culture Fund.
- IncrEdible Trent Hills in partnership with Innresponse a \$5,000 grant to hire a graphic designer to improve their branding strategy and update their website and sponsorship packages.
- <u>Kent Public School</u> in partnership with KPRDSB a \$4,747 grant towards the purchase a new climber for the playground.
- <u>The Bridge Hospice</u> a \$3,060 grant to create a short video for regional physicians and nurse practitioners regarding the patient referral process and admission criteria. Includes partial funding from the Glover Family Fund.
- Westben Arts Festival Theatre a \$5,000 grant to plant "The Selfish Giant's Garden" with native species on the Westben grounds in celebration of their 25th Anniversary Season community musical production, The Selfish Giant.

Five Job Opportunity for Youth grants were awarded from our Campbellford/Seymour Community Fund. This grant program provides students with an opportunity to learn about charitable and not-for-profit organizations, as well as develop skills for future employability.

- Artworth Trent Hills Arts & Nature Campin partnership with Innresponse a \$2,720 grant to hire a student for a 4-week placement as an Assistant Camp Coordinator.
- <u>Campbellford Memorial Hospital Foundation</u> a \$5,000 grant to hire a student for an 8-week placement as a Development Officer Assistant.
- Community Care Northumberland a \$5,000 grant to hire a student for a 9week placement as an Office Administrator.
- $\underline{\text{Inclusion Northumberland}} \text{ a $5,000 grant to hire a student for a 9-week}$ placement as a Summer Camp Counsellor.
- Rotary Club of Campbellford a \$5,000 grant to hire a student for a 12-week placement as a Canteen Operator at Kennedy Park.

One Environmental Mini Grant was awarded with funding coming from our Environmental Endowment Fund:

Lower Trent Conservation Authority - a \$375 grant to purchase a Freshwater Explorer Kit to provide opportunities for experiential learning. The kit will be made available at the Campbellford Branch of the Trent Hills Public Library as part of their "Library of Things".

Grant funding in the amount of \$71,209.81 from the Campbellford/Seymour Municipal Fund was awarded to the Municipality of Trent Hills for the new Recreation and Wellness Centre in Campbellford. This is the 10th installment for the \$1.5 million commitment made through Flourish ~ The Trent Hills Wellness Campaign.
