Our Relationship with Trees October 13, 2022

The event will include a film, <u>Call of the</u>
<u>Forest</u>, about the work of world recognized author, medical biochemist and botanist, Diana Beresford-Kroeger. Not only will we screen the film, but we will invite the audience to share their questions about how to protect our local trees and forests and pose them to Diana.

The day after the screening everyone will be invited to a lunchtime talk where Diana will use zoom to answer our questions and teach us about climate change impacts affecting plants, trees and forests in our area. We will also hear about actions being taken by Northumberland County and local conservation authorities to protect local forests and mitigate impacts of the climate crisis.
